PPE: The Basics Matter

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is one of the simplest and most effective ways we keep each other safe on the jobsite. PPE is not optional or "nice to have." It is a basic part of the job that protects us from everyday hazards we face on active job sites.

- ✓ Hard hats help protect against falling objects, overhead work, and unexpected impacts.
- ✓ Safety glasses reduce the risk of eye injuries from dust, debris, and flying materials that can cause serious injury in a split second.
- ✓ High-visibility clothing helps ensure you are seen by equipment operators, delivery drivers, and coworkers, especially in busy or low-light conditions.
- ✓ Work gloves help protect hands from cuts, abrasions, pinch points, and rough materials while improving grip and control.
- ✓ Steel-toed boots help protect feet from heavy objects, rolling equipment, and jobsite hazards while providing stability on uneven surfaces.

These are simple habits, but they make a big difference. Full PPE compliance helps prevent injuries and ensures everyone goes home safely at the end of the day.

Lake District Flats: Building with a View



The Lake District Flats project is taking shape along the Ludington lake shore, giving the crew great views while work moves forward. This four-building apartment complex will include 97 total units, with a mix of one- and two-bedroom apartments designed for modern, comfortable living.

Three of the buildings measure 25,629 square feet, with a fourth larger building totaling 39,645 square feet. Construction and occupancy are phased, with the first building scheduled to turn over and welcome residents in March and the remaining buildings following through August. In addition to providing Construction Management services, the BCI team is self-performing key scopes of work to support a smooth transition from construction to occupancy.

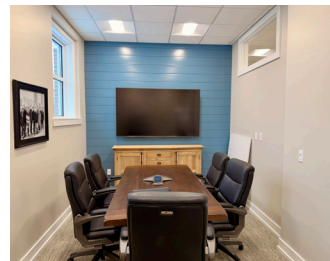
